What is the Augusta Solidarity March about? The Augusta Solidarity March demonstrates that we stand in solidarity with the preservation and progression of women's rights, as well as all of the other civil and human rights that the diverse population of women, their partners, their families, and their children encompass. We hope to bring people of the CSRA and beyond together in support of the aforementioned women's, human, and civil rights, and we hope for this march to serve as a foundation for a future of better interpersonal communication and civil discourse between all residents of the area, regardless of their political affiliation, religious association, or personal opinions.

What if I can't walk the entire march route? You are welcome to march with us as far as you are able! The route is accessible for wheelchairs, bicycles, and motorized scooters. When we reach the corner of 12th & Broad Streets, we are within 2 blocks of the start location; this is roughly half the march and a good place to stop if you cannot complete the route. Some people with mobility issues will be joining the march by vehicle; look for the vehicle organizer, Courtney Cooper, at the corner of 12th & Reynolds—find her by locating the purple balloons—to give her your vehicle information if you have not yet done so, and follow her lead when the march kicks off. Anyone driving the march route **MUST** be a licensed driver and the vehicle must have valid insurance.

What if I need help during the march? Water and Band-Aids are available from the first aid truck—look for the red balloons at the rear of the march. If you have an emergency, please call or have someone near you call 911.

How about restrooms? There are not any specific restrooms for march participants. If you need to utilize a restroom at a downtown business, please support them as you are able and, of course, treat business owners and employees with respect.

I ordered a T-Shirt online—where do I get it? Look for the silver Jeep with the white balloons at the corner of 12th and Jones Streets. They will be happy to give you any shirts you pre-ordered.


And when we are done? Do I just go home? We intend to gather at Springfield Village Park again at the conclusion of the march, weather permitting. See the back of this sheet for more to do after the march, and ways you can keep in touch with Augusta Solidarity!

Are there any restrictions or requirements regarding march participation? Yes, there is a waiver for participation (augustasolidarity.org/waiver), some requests from the organizers, and agreements in effect due to our status as an official Sister March of the national Women's March on Washington:

- We will use no violence (physical or verbal) towards any person, whether fellow marcher or protester, nor destroy or damage property.
- We will promote a tone of respect, honesty, transparency, and accountability in our actions.
- We will not carry anything that can be construed as a weapon, nor possess (or consume) any alcohol or drugs.
- We are nonpartisan, and will use the Augusta Solidarity March to express our support for women's rights and human rights in our communities and the country, rather than criticize politicians or political parties. We will not carry signs that endorse or decry any political figure or party.
- We will recognize that this space is family-friendly and not use vulgarity in our speech or signage.
- We will all hold each other accountable to respecting these agreements.

What will happen if someone does not wish to abide by the above agreement(s)? Anyone who is found to be purposefully violating the above agreements will be requested to cease their behavior(s); if they do not wish to comply they will be removed from the procession if their behavior is a liability to the spirit of the march or other participants.

What should I do in inclement weather? Please, put your own safety first! If you are not comfortable with the weather conditions, by all means, cease participation and seek shelter. We will have volunteers monitoring conditions, and will do our best to alert you to dangerous situations such as lightning, hail, or tornado watches/warnings as we are able, but please take responsibility for your own well-being.



March Route (3.78 miles)

Starting out from Springfield Village Park, we will march east on Reynolds Street to 10th Street, north on 10th Street to Riverwalk, east on Riverwalk to 6th Street, south on 6th Street to Broad, west on Broad to 12th Street, return down the opposite side of Broad to 6th Street, north on 6th Street to Riverwalk, west on Riverwalk to 10th Street, south on 10th Street to Reynolds Street, then west back to Springfield Village Park at 12th and Reynolds Streets.
